October - The Month of the Rosary

Greetings in the love of Christ!

As we have stepped into the beautiful month of October, the Church invites us to embrace a special and timeless devotion: the Holy Rosary.

The crisp autumn air and the changing leaves remind us of the cycles of life, death, and new life. In a similar way, the Rosary guides us through the joyful, luminous, sorrowful, and glorious mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary. It is a spiritual journey we are invited to take, not as solitary pilgrims, but as a family of faith.

In a world that is often noisy and tensed, the Rosary is a gentle but powerful antidote. The repetitive prayers are not meant to be empty words, but a rhythmic measure that quietens our hearts and allows us to meditate deeply on the greatest story ever told. Holding the beads in our hands, we find an anchor. With each "Hail Mary," we are like children, asking our Blessed Mother to lead us closer to her Son.

This October, I warmly encourage every family and individual to (re)discover the gift of the Rosary.

- If you are new to it, don't be intimidated! Start with one decade (an Our Father, ten Hail Marys, and a Glory Be). Let the mysteries sink into your heart.
- · If it's been a while, pick it up again. Let the familiar prayers bring you comfort and strength.
- As a family, consider praying a decade together after dinner or before bedtime. It is a beautiful way to place your home under the mantle of Our Lady's protection.

May this Month of the Rosary draw us all into a deeper, more intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. Through the intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary, may our hearts be filled with her same faith, hope, and love.

Jesus is Our Hope (1 Tim 1:1) | Take a few quiet moments to look at Jesus hanging on a Crucifix, and you will recognize that He gave everything for you. Pope Benedict XVI explained how God "gives the cross to prove to us: 'I love you. You can trust Me." During this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025, ask Jesus to increase in you the gift of hope so that you will trust Him through life's challenges and suffering, believing that He "works all things together for the good of those who love Him" (Rom 8:28).

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection October 12, 2025 - Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 KGS 5:14-17; PS 98: 1-4;2 TM 2:8-13; LK 17:11-19 Gratitude, as

we learn from today's readings, is not just a feeling, but a transformative force in the life of a Christian disciple. It leads us to worship God, the source of our salvation, and shapes our stewardship way of life. The Gospel passage from Luke vividly illustrates the role of recognition in gratitude. Only one of the ten lepers recognized the blessing he had received from Jesus and returned to thank him. This prompts us to reflect: how often do we fail to acknowledge the blessings, answered prayers, and healings that the Lord showers upon us? The truth is that our very lives and every breath we take are His gift to us. However, we can become so caught up in the stresses and distractions of daily life that we lose sight of this truth. The Samaritan's response to his healing is a powerful example of the connection between gratitude and worship. His recognition of the Lord's blessing led him to glorify God and express his gratitude. This sequence of gratitude leading to worship is a profound spiritual truth that we should all strive to embody. And because of this response, Jesus offered him a far more precious gift than physical healing; He offered him the gift of salvation. "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you." Too often, we hear the phrase, "Count your blessings," and write it off as nothing more than a trite saying. Today's Gospel shows us otherwise. Gratitude is powerful. It deepens our faith in God and leads us to fitting worship of Him.
