



# Stewardship Bulletin Reflection October 5, 2025 - Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time HAB 1:2-3; 2:2-2-4; PS 95:1-2, 6-9; 2 TM 1:6-8, 13-14; LK 17:5-10

Our readings today remind us that living a stewardship way of life — a life centered on serving God and His kingdom — is not just a duty, but a source of joy. They also show us that our lives truly belong to God, not to us, and that God will indeed bring about the fulfillment of His Kingdom. We must have faith that He can do it and dedicate ourselves to our small part in His grand plan. This is both our privilege and responsibility as Christian stewards, a joyful journey of faith. Jesus makes this privilege and responsibility clear in today's Gospel passage from Luke. When the apostles ask the Lord to increase their faith, He tells them that even a mustard seed-sized faith is enough to move mountains (because it is God who does the heavy lifting). This is a testament to His grace, a gift for which we should be grateful. We only need to take the tiniest step forward, and He will do the rest. But living our lives in His service is also our responsibility, as Jesus explains through the parable of the unprofitable servant later in this passage. Our Lord describes a scene where a servant has just come in from tending to the master's affairs and asks whether it would be reasonable for the master to start waiting on his servant. Of course, it would not be reasonable! The servant would be expected to continue serving his master until he had finished the work the master had given him that day. Jesus says we should have this same attitude before God. The time, talents, and treasure entrusted to us all belong to God. Our very lives are His. The trust He places in us, His children, demonstrates our value in His eyes. Whatever we do on God's behalf with our lives and gifts is our God-given responsibility, a sign of His trust and love for us. The stewardship way of life makes the privilege and responsibility of serving Christ and His kingdom a reality.



# Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary - October 7



The steps to praying the Rosary:

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross
- 2. Pray the Apostles' Creed (while holding the crucifix)
- 3. On the first large bead, pray the Our Father
- 4. On the next three small beads, pray a Hail Mary for each
- 5. Pray the Glory Be
- 6. Announce the First Mystery
- 7. On the next large bead, pray the Our Father
- 8. On the ten small beads that follow, pray a Hail Mary for each
- 9. After the tenth Hail Mary, pray the Glory Be
- 10. Pray the Fatima Prayer
- 11. Repeat steps 6-10 for the remaining four mysteries
- 12. Pray the Hail Holy Queen
- 13. Final Rosary Prayer
- 14. End with the Sign of the Cross
