Stewardship Bulletin Reflection November 16, 2025 - Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time MAL 3:19-20A; PS 98:5-9; 2 THES 3:7-12; LK 21:5-19 As we near

the end of the liturgical year, our readings serve as a sober reminder that this life is not our goal and that God's justice will ultimately prevail. Now is the moment to prioritize correctly, placing God above all else as His faithful stewards. Our Lord emphasizes the importance of right priorities in our Gospel passage from Luke, reminding the people nearby, who were looking at the temple, "All that you see here—the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Our Lord reminds us that everything in this world is passing. We must keep our focus on eternity. Yet, before experiencing the eternal bliss of heaven, we should expect to be tested and tried. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name." It may sound daunting, but if you embrace a stewardship lifestyle, there is no need to fear. You already have a plan. All you need to do is follow it. Place our Lord first in your time, talents, and use of treasure. This way of life is not without its challenges, but Jesus assures us that it will lead to eternal salvation and the joy of being united with Him. "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance, you will secure your lives." Keep moving forward, Christian stewards, for the struggle is nothing compared to the joy that awaits!

Pope Leo XIV's Dilexi Te ("I Have Loved You") - Dilexi Te is Pope Leo XIV's first Apostolic Exhortation. Building on a theme dear to Pope Francis and bringing to completion a document he was working on when he died, Pope Leo focuses on the preferential love for the poor so prominent in the Gospels and in Catholic Social Teaching. To read Dilexi Te and for links to a variety of resources on it from the Holy See and from the USCCB, visit the diocesan Social Concerns website or scan the QR code to the right. The resources include a reflection suitable for small group study and discussion.
