A message from Fr. Cryton,

The Summary of Bishop Battersby's Message During the Season of Advent

Bishop Battersby emphasizes that the "one thing necessary" is to fix our gaze on Jesus Christ and allow ourselves to be transformed by Him. Drawing from St. Anselm's prayer ("I seek your face"), the story of Mary and Martha, and St. Paul's writings, he makes several key points:

The Central Call: We must regularly spend time gazing upon Christ—contemplating Him in the manger, on the cross, and in His glory—to be transformed "from glory to glory" into His image through the Holy Spirit.

The Problem: We limit our transformation because we focus too much on ourselves, our fears, and the difficulties around us (like Peter sinking when he looked at the waves). In these troubled times, the enemy wants us to be distrustful of each other and Church leadership rather than submitting to God's transforming gaze.

The Solution: Trust Jesus completely. If we truly believe He is Lord, we can trust Him and His Church confidently. Both the Diocese and individual believers need to make daily and weekly time to be with Jesus, allowing Him to change us.

Practical Wisdom: The bishop values advice that comes from prayer and conformity to Christ, not mere opinion. We must cultivate a deep desire for Jesus, running to Him with our weaknesses rather than fearing them, and imitating the humility of Mary and Joseph.

Jesus is Our Hope (1 Tim 1:1) | The Advent hymn Come, O Long Expected Jesus is about hope as it refers to Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah promised throughout the Old Testament. Jesus is "the hope of all the earth" because He brings salvation to each and every person, fulfilling God the Father's universal plan for redemption. Jesus is the "dear desire of every nation" because He is the ultimate answer to the deepest longings and needs of every person.

The second verse of Come, O Long Expected Jesus:

Israel's strength and consolation, You, the hope of all the earth,

Dear desire of every nation, come, and save us by Your birth.

Let us make a good confession before Christmas to purify our hearts for the celebration of the Incarnation—God becoming man to save us from Satan, sin and death.

The Jubilee Year of Hope officially ends on January 6th when Pope Leo XIV closes the Holy Door at St. Pater's Basilica in Rome. A Mass to close the Jubilee Year in the Diocese of La Crosse will be celebrated at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman by Msgr. Richard Gilles, 10 a.m. on December 28th. All are welcome.

Stewardship Bulletin Reflection December 14, 2025 - Third Sunday in Advent IS 35:1-6A, 10; PS146:6-10; JAS 5:7-10; MT 11:2-11 Good news, Christian stewards — we are making progress in our Advent journey, and it's time to pause and rejoice in the Good News that our Savior will return in victory one day. Today's readings on this Gaudete ("Rejoice") Sunday are full of reminders of God's ultimate victory over suffering and injustice, and they encouragement to remain steadfast in our mission to living as faith-filled disciples. Such a day almost seems too good to be true, especially when we look around at the dire circumstances we face in our world today. But by faith, we know this day is coming. Lest we grow weary as we wait for the glorious day of Christ's return, St. James, in our second reading, offers wise counsel. "Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord." "Make your hearts firm... Do not complain, brothers and sisters, about one another, that you may not be judged." This is excellent advice for us, Christian stewards, as we face the challenges of daily life in our broken world, especially during the hectic days before Christmas when stress can cause us and those around us to be less than our best. St. James reminds us that we have the power to choose our response to both the major strains and minor annoyances of life. In other words, we can be good stewards of our attitude by "making our hearts firm" through practicing patience with others and refusing the temptation to complain. Remember, we have the choice to see and rejoice in God's presence with us, regardless of the circumstances we face. This is a source of hope and optimism that can guide us through the challenges of our daily lives.
