Stewardship Bulletin Reflection December 28, 2025 - Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph SIR 3:2-6, 12-14; PS 128: 1-5; COL 3:12-21 or COL 3:12-17; MT 2:13-15; 19-23 As we continue celebrating the Christmas season, today's feast of the Holy Family invites us to reflect on the gift and calling of family life. The Church calls the family the "domestic church," the place where our faith takes root — and where the stewardship virtue of hospitality begins. Consider simple ways to make your home more welcoming, such as sharing meals or praying together as a family, to foster faithfulness and love. Why is hospitality vital to family life? Because our homes should be spaces filled with love, welcome, and renewal. We can't expect to grow in prayer, service, or faith if our home environment feels disconnected or tense. Even when conflicts occur, intentionally practicing patience and forgiveness helps build a home where everyone feels loved and appreciated, despite imperfections. Our readings provide practical wisdom. In the Book of Sirach, we learn about the blessings that come when children respect their parents — and when grown children lovingly care for their aging parents. Respect and tenderness foster a home filled with unity and peace. St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians provides even more insight. He reminds us that each family member is "God's chosen one" and encourages us to "put on" compassion, kindness, humility, and patience — even when we don't feel like it. These small, daily acts of love foster genuine hospitality at home, which then extends to the larger community. The Holy Family also faced hardships. As today's Gospel reminds us, they encountered danger, displacement, and uncertainty. Yet Mary and Joseph stayed faithful, trusting in God's plan. They serve as powerful intercessors for our families today. On this feast, may we renew our commitment to making our homes places of love and welcome. Let's honor God by how we treat each other at home—with patience, forgiveness, and kindness. Happy Feast of the Holy Family to everyone who embodies the stewardship lifestyle!
